



Your Blueprint To Create The Perfect Trivia Quiz

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In the Blink of An Eye! – A Super Quick Start Guide

With this super quick start guide, you can be up and running with your very own trivia quiz in two shakes of a fiddlers elbow!

Step 1:

Print out this document. Ideally you should read through the full starter kit (Recommended). Either way move on to step two now.

Step 2:

You will notice the kit contains six pages of questions to use in your trivia quiz. Four mixed trivia question rounds, and Two bonus question rounds are included, containing various trivia questions in Design and Industry and Food and Drink categories. Each round contains ten questions. Use these questions (if you wish) and include as many rounds as you desire depending on how long you want your quiz to be. Print off one set of questions for whoever will be the quizmaster!

Step 3:

Print off as many answer sheets as needed. A selection of answer sheets are provided to cater for any number of rounds. For example if you decide to have a six round quiz then print off two three round answer sheets per team and so on. Remember everyone doesn't need to have an answer sheet just every quiz team or quiz team captain.

Step 4:

Print off one quizmaster score sheet and the required number of team score sheets. This helps everyone keep track of the score as the quiz progresses, so everyone knows what's going on!
Now lets move onto the final few steps needed to create your very own Super Dooper Trivia Quiz, that everyone can enjoy!

In the Blink of An Eye! – A Super Quick Start Guide

Step 5:

Print off the raffle numbers if you would like to give away spot prizes, using a raffle format. We recommend printing these numbers on card paper (if possible) that way you can reuse the numbers again. Put all the numbers into a container (Use a top hat if you want) then ask quiz participants to pick a number between one and one hundred. Pass around the number picker sheet so people can select a number to be in with a chance of winning a special prize. Select how many prizes you wish to give away in your quiz. Generally three is a satisfactory number of spot prizes, with the first prize being better than second prize and so on!

Step 6:

Follow the checklist provided in order to make sure you don't overlook something and help ensure you have the basics sorted.

Step 7:

Print off the trivia promotion posters (select the one you like most) and fill in the information with a marker/sharpie pen. Place the poster somewhere it will be seen i.e. on a notice board, on the fridge, try and pick a busy spot where people will see it! Remember to remove it after the quiz unless scheduled otherwise!

Step 8: Get to the venue early and prepare everything in advance!

Step 9: It's Quiz Time! Smile, Be yourself and Follow the Process!

Step 10:

Congratulate yourself on hosting the perfect trivia quiz! Ask people for feedback. Remember, take what they say with a pinch of salt unless a common issue emerges, if it does address it for next time!

What's it All About Then? – A Brief Introduction

“A little knowledge is a dangerous thing” – Albert Einstein

OK so what is a trivia quiz and where did it originate?

At its most simple a trivia quiz is where people are asked questions on a wide range of topics and they must either collectively or individually answer them. The person or team that answers the most questions correctly usually wins, unless some sort of winner takes all question is used. The great thing about trivia quizzes is that they are ideal for any age group. A well planned trivia quiz can be engaging and fun for kids/adults. In a trivia quiz, everyone has a chance to answer questions in their particular area of interest, whatever that may be.

The origins of the trivia quiz as we know it, can be dated back to the early 1960's, where nostalgic students began to trade questions about their youth, which they discovered was actually quite good fun. Topics of interest were selected, and then made into competitions and games shortly afterwards.

The first trivia contests were believed to have been organised by Ed Goodgold with the help of Dan Carlinsky, who published books on the subject around the same time. The first mention of trivia as a game was in a Columbia student newspaper column that was published on the 5th February 1965.

Fascinating Fact: The largest Trivia Contest in the world, is held in the University of Wisconsin. It takes place every year over the course of a weekend, and consists of approximately 400 teams with between 1 and 150 players in each team.

A Red Sky At Night! – Trivia Nights and Why They Rock

It is often said that a red sky at night is a shepherd's delight! It's considered a spiritual sign of good things to come. When you experience your first trivia quiz, it too may be symbolic of the many great quizzes to look forward to, for many years to come!

If you have never been to a pub quiz or trivia quiz night before, then you should make it your first port of call. You will learn best by soaking up what a real quiz night actually involves. The chances are you will have great fun, and really enjoy yourself. There's something about the warm and friendly environment of a cosy pub, surrounded by warm and inquisitive people, that make trivia nights a special occasion, for people of all ages to enjoy together.

If you are stuck for time and need to setup a quiz ASAP or maybe there aren't any quizzes near you, then congratulations, this starter kit will provide everything you need, to get the wheels for your very own trivia quiz in motion. The starter kit is aimed at helping you create a trivia quiz in just a matter of minutes. Just print everything off and you're ready to go!

So what is it that makes trivia quizzes a very special way to spend an hour or two? Well here are some of the most obvious;

- You get to meet and interact with new people
- You get to test and share your worldly knowledge
- You get to challenge yourself
- You get to spend valuable time with friends and family
- You might discover a friend or even a partner for life
- You might learn something you never knew before
- You might discover new books, songs, games, hobbies etc.
- You might even win a prize

Getting Your Ducks in a Row? – Working it All Out

This simple guide and toolkit aims to make it easy for everyone, no matter how busy, to host their own trivia quiz and enjoy the Fun and entertainment it brings.

The idea of this starter kit is to give you all the key elements needed to host your own quiz. Your first quiz might be for family, friends, work colleagues or complete strangers, either way use this starter kit as a guiding template to get momentum, and let it be the seed for many a great trivia quiz night to come. Remember that you will be helping people of all ages to enjoy spending time together in a friendly and welcoming environment!

Hopefully once you get your first quiz under your belt you will then host another and then another, giving life to something that beforehand never existed. With a little persistence, you can make it an event that people look forward to again and again.

Remember;

“Large streams from little fountains flow, Tall oaks from little acorns grow” **D. Everett – (From The Columbian Orator 1797)**

In the next number of pages you will find, all the material needed to host your quiz. Some material can be used over and over again like the score sheets and the spot prize raffle numbers. The questions provided, are suitable for a good hour long quiz, and less if you decide to leave out some quiz rounds.

There are sixty quiz questions provided in total, which equates to six rounds, with ten questions in each round. There are four mixed trivia rounds and two bonus rounds for you to use if you wish!

When in Rome! – Some Quizmaster Basics

Tip #1 – Use a Microphone where possible – Especially if you are of a soft spoken nature. A microphone will ensure everyone hears you, and the need to repeat questions lessens considerably when you use a microphone. Check if your venue has this facility!

Tip #2 – Remember You're the Boss – The position of quizmaster is to help facilitate the enjoyment of a quiz for all involved! A good quizmaster includes the odd joke or fascinating fact, which helps liven things up, especially in a pub setting. If your audience is receptive you might even include a bonus round or spot prizes, for the team that has the best joke to share. The vast majority of quizzes run smoothly however on the off chance that you meet an awkward individual it is important to be seen to be firm but fair in your interactions, and of course you as quizmaster must have the final say, if an issue arises regarding questions or answers.

Tip #3 – Always Be Yourself – What a cliché! But it rings true in many areas of life. The world doesn't need any more fakes. What it does need are more people who trust in their own capabilities, and discover their have a go spirit and use it. Remember you either win or you learn! Its that simple! Life is too short not to try!

Tip #4 – Preparation is Key – As with anything in life, you get out what you put in. Make sure everything is setup in advance before the quiz begins, this helps to avoid errors and build confidence.

Tip #5 – Speak Slowly – Remember a quiz with 40-50 questions should last at least an hour, so don't rush even if it is your first time as the de facto quizmaster. Welcome everyone at the start and give them a run down of what the quiz will entail. When you start speaking at the beginning of the quiz ask if the volume is ok.

That's a Good Question! – Personalising Your Trivia Quiz

Adding an interval round at the halfway point in your quiz helps to make your quiz even more engaging and fun!

This is where you insert questions of your own making that relate to local interests or currently trending topics making the headlines or which have made the headlines in recent weeks/months! So you may be wondering, what makes a good or bad question?

Bad Question - What came first the chicken or the egg?

Answer – eh?? Egg!... No chicken!... No egg!

This is an example of the type of question that is best avoided if you are looking to run a well oiled trivia quiz, that everyone can feel like they have made a meaningful contribution towards 😊

A more suitable question would be something like;

Better Question - In what year did Neil Armstrong become the first man to walk on the moon?

Answer: - 1969 (There is no grey area with this answer!)

(Bonus Point – For a bonus point on what date exactly?

Answer: - 20th July 1969)

* Using and including a bonus point question can help determine the eventual winners depending on the type of scoring system you are using. It helps eliminate the need for a tie breaker question. **In regards to scoring its probably best to award 1 point for a correct answer, 0 points for a wrong answer and two points for a correct bonus answer.**

That's a Good Question! – Personalising Your Trivia Quiz

Continued;

Any question with a wishy washy answer, or no definitive answer is going to prove to be a rocky road, and will only lead to confusion, annoyance, and frustration for quiz players of all levels.

It's best to avoid questions that only an expert in a certain topic/field of study would know the answer to. No one wants to feel like they are in some quantum wormhole (or whatever the equivalent situation may be) where only the input of Albert Einstein himself, could possibly answer the questionS asked!

That being said the interval questions you generate (if you decide to use them) should not be overly simplistic either, unless you are intentionally involving younger children in your quiz. For example asking a group of seasoned adult quiz goers - what colour is Rudolf's nose? is sure to raise a few eyebrows and get a few groans of disdain and sporadic watch checking.

Instead a better approach is to try and strike a balance where a mix of easy, moderate and challenging questions are included in order to keep the quiz ticking away nicely.

Here are some useful ideas for creating interval questions;

- **Headline News Events**
- **Local/National Focus (People, Places, Things etc.)**
- **Celebrity Gossip, Sports, Politics, T.V.**
- **Identify This Piece of Music (Play Pre Recorded Music Intro's)**
- **Guess The Year**
- **Who Said That (A Quotation Round)**
- **Picture Quiz (Showing partial images of Celebrities faces)**
- **Odd One Out Round (Word or Picture Format - Find the odd one out in a group of photos or select from a written list)**

Are We There Yet? – Keeping Score

Keeping tabs on the score in a trivia quiz is easy, when you use an answer sheet like the one provided on the following pages.

All the teams need is a pen/pencil to write down their answers.

Usually the best way to keep things interesting and competitive is to run through the answers after each round, this helps add competition and suspense to a quiz, and give teams useful feedback after each round, as opposed to waiting to the very end of the quiz to run through the answers.

The quizmaster will need to have their answer sheets close at hand in order to provide the answers to the questions.

There are three ways of keeping track of any right or wrong answers;

- Each team scores their own answers which is the usually the most efficient method in many cases.
- Teams swop their answer sheets with each other
- Answer sheets get handed to quizmaster/third party to mark, and the score is totalled after each round. Usually only reserved for the more serious quiz environments.

* Remember to note down the score as you go, so you can make things appear competitive between the teams. It might also be worthwhile to double check answer sheets at the end, before you hand out the prizes, just in case a mistake was made somewhere. That's it for score keeping. It's quite simple really!

Everyone's a Winner! – Prizes and Rewards

I don't like winning prizes said no one ever! 😊

Prizes essentially add the icing to the cake of a good quiz night, and can be the difference in making a dull quiz seem exciting.

A simple thing like having prizes to giveaway, is all that is needed in order to ensure people put in the effort to win a quiz.

Prizes are a great way to send people away after a trivia quiz, with a smile on their face, and helps make the night more memorable.

There are lots of different prizes that can be incorporated into your quiz. Some ideas for prizes include;

- **Raffle Draw Spot Prizes** - (Buy a raffle book or print off the list of numbers contained in this starter kit). During the interval ask people to pick a number to enter the draw. A ticket is then drawn from a drum/bucket of the numbers selected and prizes are given to the person who has the corresponding number - The number of prizes is up to you!
- **The Closest Guess Prize** - Teams are asked to answer a very specific question, and the closest guess to the answer, gets a prize. For ex (How many rivets were used to build the titanic?)
- **The Best Joke of the Night Prize** - A prize for anyone who offers to share a joke. If there's more than one then the funniest joke wins a prize.)

* Feel free to invent and include your own cheesy prize also 😊

Full Steam Ahead! – Checking the Checklist

Checklist;

- Print and Read This Starter Kit**
- Find A Suitable Venue** (i.e. pub, club, school, workplace and then outline your plans to host a fun trivia night to the owner (outlining the benefits). A trivia quiz can be a great way to attract people to a venue where food/drink etc. can be served, alongside the quiz you are hosting.
- Advertise the Quiz** (Source Promotional Materials and then advertise in a suitable way) Tell friends, work colleagues and anyone who will help spread the word *Hint use the free posters provided in this kit if you wish.
- Create Some Interval Round Questions and Answers** (This is not necessary however you may want to include a round that is tailored to your audience type which can help to make your quiz more current or specialised).
- Source Suitable Prizes and Giveaways** (Get sponsors if you don't have the initial money for prizes or if you want to keep the quiz entry free for people) You don't need extravagant prizes, however the prize should be in keeping with any contributions given by the quiz players as a group.
- Source Any Materials** Pens/Pencils, Timer (If you wish), Projector (If Needed), print images, create t-shirts, hats and provide snacks and refreshments if you wish.

Full Steam Ahead! – Checking the Checklist

Checklist Continued;

- Remember to Print Enough Score Sheets** (You can always use them for your next trivia quiz).
- Keep a Quiz Folder** (It will help you to stay organised, save you time and make it easy for someone else to take over, if you can't attend a quiz night for whatever reason, and if you decide to pass the quizmaster hat on to someone else later on).
- Create a Simple Outline of How Your Quiz Will Be Structured.** This will help you to plan when prizes will be given, or if you need a projector to play a clip of music etc. (always be thinking of new ways to make the quiz more entertaining – (think about using sounds, images, videos, unusual objects etc.).
- Answer Any Quiz Related Calls or Emails.** This will help you get an idea of the number of people that may attend your quiz, or indeed make you aware of any issues beforehand.
- Find a Sidekick.** You don't need one but having someone else in your corner can make life easier. They can help you setup and prepare, while also helping to run your trivia quiz. Having someone as a backup is very useful in case the quizmaster isn't able to attend for whatever reason.

A Bird in the Hand! – Learn As You Go

Truth be known most people are beaten before they start. They habitually run the record of every reason why they can't or won't be able to do something. What ever happened to running the record for every reason you will achieve something, why you can and will do it?

The latter is the only inner vocal record you should be listening to, in order to see any meaningful positive progress in your life.

The reality is the longer that most people allow things to stew over in their minds without taking action, the less likelihood the thing has of getting started, never mind finished.

Don't let this be you! Take action now!

Now is the time to take action so if you haven't printed off this action plan yet, then please do. If you have then well done but your not off the hook yet. The next step is to work through the checklist provided until your setup. Obviously only so much can be provided in this starter kit. You will need to provide the other few elements like a venue, people, some basic materials and either be the quizmaster or find a suitable quizmaster instead.

It's probably safe to say you came here with good intentions and you've read to this point so the assumption is you are fully committed to hosting a trivia quiz of your own. Good! The research and persistence you have shown, will be rewarded when all is said and done. Your almost there now so make one last push and you will enjoy the fruits of your labour!
